Dahlia Dudes and Dudettes,

Getting some color in the yard yet? JoAnna and I planted the end of April and we have already gotten some disc blooms scattered through the garden. Our cuttings are doing pretty well but most of our tubers are very slow. I dug some up thinking they might be rotten but almost all are growing but hadn't gotten out of the ground yet. Perhaps the tubers are confused after the wet winter and hot/cold/rainy/cold/hot weather we have been getting. Be careful when watering in the hot weather. Water early or late in the day and don't over water. Put down mulch around the base of your plants as this will keep the roots cool.

JoAnna and I dropped by Kristy's garden in Lake Side Park. The dahlia spot is great for visitors as the new entrance into the gardens will go right by the dahlias. Chris has helped plant some seedlings and Deva has helped as well.

I have been warning dahlia planters to keep an eye out for snails, slugs and earwigs after the wet winter. Our earwig and snail population is under control but the slugs have really been pests. Keep putting down something to control these pests. I have seen some mildew on some of the dahlias in 4" pots that we haven't gotten in the ground. We have been seeing aphids on our roses as well as the dahlias in 4" pots. This worries me as with the gale force winds we have seen this Spring, these can spread all over the yard.

This is an exciting show season for us. We will be hosting the Pacific Southwest Dahlia Conference in February 2018 so that makes our show the Conference show. Several special medals and awards will be given out for winners in this show. Remember that our show will be August 19 and 20 at the San Leandro Library. This is two weeks later than our usual show.

John voiced concern that he and JoAnna have been the primary tuber and cutting contributors in recent years for our sale. Hopefully more members will do so in the future.


Roy demonstrated his "kneeler" to those that might wish to get aid in their garden work. Can also be used as as seat.
