It is already the middle of March and in another month it will be dahlia planting time. Time flies slowly when you are at home and can't go out without a mask and there really aren't a lot of places to go even with a mask. Better days are coming.

Some things to think about... While we can't do anything, it would be a good idea to check your tubers and make sure they are in good shape. Inventory the extra ones you have and get a count of them so you can donate to them to the club and still have enough for you to plant. If they are not eyeing up, showing growth, you might spritz them with water and put them in a warm spot. That usually will get the ones going that are going to grow. (Do not water but just give the medium you have your tubers in a spray of water.) Make sure your tubers are labeled. A felt pen on a dry tuber works well. To save time and tuber writing space, you might abbreviate Hollyhill with HH and Bloomquist with BQ. Some people will circle the eye or eyes with the felt pen to help new growers see what direction to set the tuber in the ground.

We will be given the complete rundown on our tuber/plant sale at our meeting. Last year was the first time we did a virtual sale and it went very smoothly from my point of view. Please jot down the "do by" dates as those that are keeping inventory and pictures will really need this information in a timely manner. Please volunteer as needed. This is your club so help out as you can.
