Letter from the President

As I write this, the temperatures are hitting the mid-80s in the East Bay. Many of us are still planting tubers, which will start sprouting with the warm weather. June is not too late to plant. That is, if you have more spaces to fill. Keep your plants watered and give them a light shower on these hot days to keep them cool.

At our May meeting, Sabrina and her daughter Evie, shared two Junior Grower projects. Two planter boxes at Roosevelt School facing Dutton will be their first project. They will pull the weeds out, plant native plants and wildflowers, and care for it for a Girl Scout Bronze Award project. Their project will help pollinators and boost



biodiversity in our neighborhoods by starting native pollinator and wildflower gardens. They plan to help interested neighbors turn their unused parking strips into pollinator havens. In the Roosevelt School Garden, the growers were given a raised bed space for Junior Growers (some of whom signed up at the Cherry Festival) will be able to grow and tend dahlias. All of the dahlia plants and amendments are being donated by the dahlia society and our members.

Our first San Leandro Dahlia Society Cherry Festival booth was a great success. Many members came (very) early to arrange over 150 plants, set up the tables, signage and photos. Our booth was gorgeous! We made many sales as well as exposed lots of the festival goers to dahlia culture and the benefits of joining our Society. It was a fun day as we all had the opportunity to socialize with each other as well. A big thank you to Peggy Murphy for heading up this adventure. Let's return next year!

Digital Clerking with Kristi Whitfield

For the past couple years Kristi has been working on getting our show judging transferred to an electronic system. On the following pages you will see an article that she has submitted to the ADS Bulletin. Read on for a special preview of her work.

The dahlia shows in sunny California are getting a tech makeover. Remember the old days when your local library ditched the card catalogs in favor of computer databases? It felt like stepping into a complicated future, didn't it? Well, a similar tech evolution is about to bloom at dahlia shows across California! Get ready, because 2024 might be the first year we say goodbye to paper and pencil and hello to digital entry for show results.

From Paper Trails to Digital Tales

Let's take a stroll down memory lane. For ages, we've been cozying up with pencils and paper, jotting down the judges' picks. Judges would mark their floral favorites, and clerks, armed with a rainbow of colored stickers, would scribble down the winners and their exhibitor numbers. Clerks lugged around hefty 3-ring binders, bursting with papers, through rows of radiant dahlias. Then ensued the late-night tallies, the endless counting, and the reports that took forever to compile. Oh, the nostalgia!

2024: A Digital Dawn

This year, our binders are being shelved, and in their place, clerks will wield their smartphones as they accompany the judges. The master tally file will be updated on-the-go, with every tap bringing us closer to instantaneous results. Welcome to the digital age of dahlia shows!

How Does It Work?

At the heart of this transformation is an Excel workbook, a digital garden of spreadsheets for data entry, lists of classified dahlias and exhibitors, and automated summaries. It's all saved on a cloud server at Microsoft, where multiple clerks can log in and work together in harmony. The game-changer here is Excel's "card view" feature on the mobile app, which simplifies data entry by displaying one spreadsheet line per card—clear, concise, and incredibly user-friendly. Here's the magic in action: each clerk enters results into the master tally file via their mobile phones. A clerk manager oversees the entire operation from a central laptop, ensuring everything runs smoothly. Once the judging and data entry are complete, reports are generated with just a click. Voila! Instant results.

Why Go Digital?

The benefits of this digital system are numerous and significant:

1. **Real-Time Collaboration**: With data saved on a server-based file, multiple clerks can work on it simultaneously, eliminating the need for post-show compilation.

2. **Error Reduction**: Real-time error checking means fewer mistakes. If a classification number is incorrect, the system flags it immediately, allowing clerks and judges to correct it on the spot.

3. **Streamlined Process**: Judges and clerks no longer need to lug around binders. The Excel app on their phones is all they need.

• **User-Friendly**: Clerks use their own phones, loaded with the Excel app, making the transition smoother and more intuitive.

Legibility and Accuracy: Digital entry means no more deciphering messy handwriting or misplaced entries.

4. **Automated Reporting**: Instant summaries and detailed reports are generated as soon as the judging is finished.

- Show Reports: From sweepstakes points ranking to an itemized list of cash prizes and winning entries, everything is at your fingertips.
- Regional and National Reports: The system generates all necessary reports for local, regional, and ADS requirements effortlessly.

What's Needed?

Transitioning to this digital system requires a few essentials:

- An Excel workbook set up with all necessary spreadsheets and hosted on a server (we use Microsoft).
- A Microsoft Office 365 Family account for clerks to log in.
- A manager laptop to oversee operations during the show.
- Phones or Android phones with the latest Microsoft Excel app installed for each clerk.
- Reliable cellular or Wi-Fi connection at the show site.
- Sufficient phone battery or chargers and a power strip for recharging.
- A clerk manager to monitor the tally file and troubleshoot any issues.
- A comprehensive training session via Zoom to equip clerks with the knowledge and tools for success.

Training for Success

A week before the show, clerks participate in a 60–90-minute Zoom training session to:

- Learn about entry forms and judging details.
- Set up their phones for digital tally.
- Download the Excel app, log in, and navigate to 'card view' for data entry.
- Troubleshoot common issues, such as blooms from the drop-down list.




